

Meeting Minutes for March 8, 2019

Ellen Collins called to order the March 9, 2019 meeting the CCHPC at 9am at the Clayton County Development Office (CCDG). The following members were in attendance: Lee Lenth, John Nikolai, Betty Buchholz, Milton Johnson and Roger Thomas.

Nikolai moved that the meeting agenda be approved as printed, Lenth seconded the motion, motion carried.

The minutes from the February 15, 2019 meeting were reviewed. Nikolai moved that the minutes be approved as printed, Johnson seconded the motion, motion carried.

Thomas updated members about the 9 bridges on the historic bridges list from the DOT bridge survey done in 1991. He also said there is an opportunity through the county development office to have a professional photographer take pictures of the nine bridges. The purpose of the attaining quality photos is to use them for a possible bridge tour, being place on National Historic Registry or include photos on the stone structure website. Johnson and Thomas plan to survey the bridges as soon as the weather and road conditions allow.

Nikolai discussed the \$350 video system option from John's TV Service. He shared that a flash drive can be produced with selected photos of the clock tower rehabilitation. The flash drive would be used on a TV place on the second floor of the courthouse. Although, the preferred location on the second floor may require installing an electric outlet. Signage will be placed on the first floor to encourage visitors to view the video on the second floor.

Collins asked members to send her names of anyone involved in the clock tower restoration.

Thomas reported on actions on barns. He shared that he was contacted by the Iowa Barn Foundation to check on a barn owned by Nick Hooper that was for sale. Thomas did contact the owner of the barn and was told that the barn was sold and would be dismantled.

With no further business, Johnson moved that the meeting adjourn, seconded by Lenth, motion carried.
